Our Pre-K program is for children that will be four years old by December. The program will run three days per week: Monday, Wednesday & Friday. Time is from 10:00am till 12:00noon. Parents are not required to stay. Program is ready to start Monday June 7th, 2010. Cost is free.

The children will be involved in reading readiness, which consists of the alphabet, phonics and vocabulary building. Math readiness covers number recognition, measurements, and simple addition / subtraction. Other topics covered during the pre-k school year are community helpers, safety awareness, movement and dancing, art and science.

This program includes free play, opening activities, theme related activities and crafts, and exercises. The pre-k program is designed to help your child get ready for his/her school years.

Bourbon Balls: To toast nuts: Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (177 degrees C) and have rack in center of oven. Place the pecans on a baking sheet and toast for about 8 minutes, or until lightly browned and fragrant. Let cool completely and then finely chop
Process the vanilla wafer cookies in your food processor until finely chopped. Add the crumbs to the chopped pecans. To this mixture add the confectioners sugar and cocoa powder and stir until combined. Add the corn syrup and bourbon and mix well. Chill if necessary and then shape into 1 inch (2.5 cm) balls. Place the sifted confectioners sugar into a small bowl and roll the bourbon balls in the sugar.

Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator. These are best if made several days in advance of serving to allow the flavors to mingle. Serve at room temperature. Makes about 48 Bourbon Balls

Ingredients

1 cup (100 grams) pecans or walnuts
2 cups (220 grams) vanilla wafer cookies, finely crushed
1/2 cup (55 grams) confectioners sugar (powdered or icing)
2 tablespoons (15 grams) cocoa powder (can use Dutch processed or regular unsweetened cocoa powder)
1 1/2 tablespoons light corn syrup
1/4 cup (60 ml) bourbon

Garnish:

1/2 cup (55 grams) confectioners sugar (powdered or icing), sifted
